# **INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS of IJLR**

## **General Instructions:**

Prospective authors are strongly urged to communicate with the Associate Editor or the Editor-in-Chief: Prof. Dr. Massoud A.H. Tel: 203-4246485, 203-4241539, Fax: 203-4299083, E-mail: <u>saad@internetalex.com</u> E-Mail: <u>saad1935@yahoo.com</u> before submitting an article, and to furnish a one-page outline of the proposed article and information as to its type, audience and probable length (limit 25 journal pages).

## Style:

Manuscripts not exceeding 25 printed pages should be attached and sent to the Editor-in-Chief via e-mail. Use separate attached files for text, tables and figures. The manuscript should be prepared in MS-WORD or PDF FORMAT ONLY, double-spaced, single-sided, 12-point font, Times New Roman 1-inch margins all around as a single column and justified throughout. An un-numbered cover page should include the title of the paper and author's names, postal addresses, faxes and emails. The corresponding author should be identified with an asterisk. The title of the paper should be 14-point font, bold, range left. Only the first letter of the first word should be in a capital, unless proper nouns are used and the rest of title must be all in lower case letters. Leave a line space and start the author's names(s), without degrees or qualifications, in 12-point font, range left. Follow this on a new line with the author's addresses, faxes, and e-mails also in 12-point font, range left. The following pages of the text should be numbered consecutively. Number the lines on each page to enable the reviewers to refer to items in the text easily (this can be done automatically by most word processors). Although electronic manuscript submission is preferable, submission via mail to the Editor-in-Chief (three hard copies and the version on diskette) is also acceptable. Manuscripts submitted to IJLR should contain: concise and definitive title of article, authors' names, authors' institutional affiliations, abstract (300-500 words suitable for abstracting services), up to 8 key words on a new line following the abstract, main text including introduction, study area, material and methods, results, discussion, conclusion, references, acknowledgments, tables (each starting with a caption and on a separate page) and figure captions on a separate page, list of references, list of symbols and abbreviations (if necessary). Nutrient concentrations should be reported as molar;  $\mu$ M nitrite and not as  $\mu$ g nitrite 1<sup>-1</sup>. Use the unit " $\mu$ g 1<sup>-1</sup> and not  $\mu$ g / 1". Paragraphs should be indented 5 character spaces, with no line space between paragraphs. Authors whose native language is not English are strongly advised to have their manuscripts checked by English speaking colleagues prior to submission. Authors may use either English or American spelling, but only one form of spelling is to be used in any one paper.

## Author Names and Affiliations:

It is IJLR policy that all those who have participated significantly in the technical aspects of a paper be recognized as co-authors or cited in the acknowledgments. Author name should consist of first name, middle initial and last name. The author affiliation should consist of the following, as applicable, in the order noted: University, institute, agency or company, with the relevant department and division, postal address; city, state, zip code, country, fax, and e-mail.

# Abstract:

A short abstract (300-500 words maximum) should open the paper. It should not attempt to condense the whole subject matter into a few words for quick reading. Its purposes are:

- 1) To give a clear indication of the objective, scope and results of the paper so that readers may determine whether the full text will be of particular interest to them;
- 2) To provide key words and phrases for indexing, abstracting, and retrieval purposes.

## **Abbreviations:**

Where long words are repeated throughout the text, shortened versions or initials can be included in parentheses after the long words first appear and then only the shortened versions are to be used.

## Tables:

Number tables consecutively with Arabic numeral. They should be self-explanatory and give each a clear descriptive title at the top. Type them on separate pages but indicate in the margin of the manuscript where they should be placed. Tables should be of such a size that they will easily fit onto a journal page. Footnotes to tables indicated by lower case letters are acceptable.

## **Figures:**

All illustrations (line drawings and photographs) should be referred as "Fig. 1" throughout the text and figure captions. All figures should be numbered with consecutive Arabic numbers and have descriptive captions on a separate page. They must be mentioned in the text and submitted separate. Their approximate position should be indicated in the margin of the manuscript. Color illustrations are accepted, but will incur a charge of US\$ 50 per figure or composite figure.

#### **Photographs:**

Photographs must be submitted for printing in the desired final size to avoid any reduction. Photographs, including their legends, must not exceed 22 X 16 cm. They should be of sufficiently high quality. Do not indicate the magnification in the legend, but by a rule on the photograph.

#### **Review of Manuscripts:**

Submitted manuscript will be reviewed by anonymous referees and those not meeting the journal's requirements and standards will be rejected. The final decision on publication is made by the Editor-in-Chief upon recommendation of an Associate Editor and / or an Editorial Board Member. If the manuscript is accepted for publication in IJLR, it must not be published in any periodical elsewhere without the permission of the Editor-in-Chief.

#### **Special Issues:**

From time to time, Guest Editors are invited to produce Special Issues consisting of some articles grouped around a common theme. Proposals for Special Issues are welcome, as are Guest Editorials and Announcements.

#### **Copy Right:**

Each manuscript must be accompanied by a statement that it has been neither published nor submitted for publication, in whole or in part, either in a serial, professional journal or as a part in a book which is formally published and made available to the public. For the mutual benefit and protection of authors and publishers it is necessary that authors provide formal written consent to publish and transfer of copyright Copyright Form before publication of the work.

Proofs will be sent to the corresponding author and should be returned with one week of receipt. Corrections should be restricted to typesetting errors; any other corrections may be charged to the authors. Authors are advised to check their proofs very carefully before return, since the inclusion of late corrections cannot be acceptable. Corrected proofs are to be returned to the publishers.

#### **Publication Cost:**

Authors of accepted papers are requested to arrange page charges of their papers at the rate of **US\$20** per printed page and **US\$50** per printed colored figure or a composite figure, which will be invoiced, through the author, to the author's company, institute, or agency. Fifty reprints of a paper are provided to the authors free of charge. Additional sets of reprints may be ordered at the time of proof correction. Page charges are mandatory and omitted ONLY when it will be highly recommended by the Editor-in-Chief to us for publication. Page charges may be reduced to 50% to be only **US\$10** per printed page for authors from developing countries and from countries in restricted financial support for researches upon request and after the approvals of the Editor-in-Chief.

#### **Frequency of Publication:**

Four issues will be published per annum.
