The Cultural Landscapes Field School: Northeastern Italy

March 26 – 27, 2010 (pre-trip sessions)

May 13 – 26, 2010

Course Credits:

NRI Students will register in NRI 7110 T60 The Cultural Landscapes Field School: Northeastern Italy (**3 credit hours**)

Geography and Geology Students will register in GEOG 4670 T60 The Cultural Landscapes Field School: Northeastern Italy (**3 credit hours**)

(No knowledge of Italian language required)

This course is taught in two segments. A 9 hour pre-trip workshop will be held evening of March 26 and day of March 27 to review trip logistics, learn sketchbook basics and assign student topics for course projects. The field school begins on May 13th in Venice (ends May 26th). This course will introduce students to the everyday practice of living cultural landscapes in northeastern Italy and their linkages to global flows of commodities, knowledge, and contemporary conservation policies. Students will learn to work as part of an interdisciplinary team.

The field school will begin with three days orientation in Venice then travel by van to the valley of Belluno in the foothills of the Italian Dolomites for seven days learning about the contemporary dynamics of the pre-alpine cultural landscape. The group will then visit a national park that presents the linkage between geology, mining and settlement patterns and finally stop at a forest reserve established by the Venetian Republic. Students should be aware that this is a field course and therefore, a reasonable level of fitness is required.

Travel fee is \$1,700.00 Cdn. (subject to change) which includes shared accommodation, breakfasts and lunch OR dinner most days, interpreter services, local transportation, some museum entrance fees, and related travel/study costs. Travel costs to and from Venice, personal expenses, health and trip cancellation insurance, as well as University of Manitoba tuition are not included. Participants are responsible for their own travel arrangements and must be in Venice in accordance with the

published course dates.

Travel fees may be paid by cheque (payable to The University of Manitoba), VISA, MasterCard, or in cash. The following is the Travel Fee Payment Schedule:

Full travel fee payment of \$1,700.00 is due March 1, 2010 (includes \$500.00 non-refundable deposit).

Academic Fees are payable separately as specified by the University of Manitoba.

In order to participate in a travel/study course, all students must sign an Acknowledgment of Responsibility and Liability Waiver that outlines risk and shared responsibility associated with travel/study.

Students are advised that a passport is required. Information on obtaining travel documents is available from Foreign Affairs, phone 1-800-567-6868.

All students must have approval of the instructor (written consent of the department head if required). Priority will be given to CHRFEER students. This travel/study course is also available to individuals not seeking degree credit. Those interested should contact Karen Nickerson for more information on how to register.
